Updates to Approved Covid 19 Policies – July 4, 2022 End of Serpent River First Nation State of Emergency

At the June 28th, 2022 Chief and Council meeting policies that were created by the Emergency Operations Control Group during the State of Emergency were brought for review. Below are the highlights of the changes:

1. Medical Transportation Policy

- this policy will remain in place and now called Medical Transportation Respiratory Infection Prevention policy
- the barrier will remain in place in the medical vans
- If more than one client is being transported then all passengers in the van will be asked to wear a mask. One will be provided if needed.

2. Proof of Vaccination Policy

- This policy will remain in place with some changes
- This policy will only apply to SRFN employees and C&C, it will no longer apply to contractors, visiting health professionals and volunteers
- All new hires for SRFN will be asked to provide Proof of Vaccination
- **This policy will be reviewed again in 6 months**

3. Mandatory Masking Policy

- This policy was removed
- There is no longer a Mandatory Masking policy for the community with the exception of the Health Centre and Geka

4. Covid-19 Testing Policy- old policy

- No Changes to be made - Policy on New Template

5. Serpent River First Nation Emergency Plan - Border Policy Manual

- The policy was removed

6. Reducing Covid-19 in the Workplace Policy

- this policy was changed to be called Reducing Illness in the Workplace

- Preventing communicable disease requires assessing your risk for communicable disease transmission in the workplace. The risk of certain communicable diseases may increase from time to time or seasonally. This may occur at a local or regional level, or within a certain workplace. We continue to need a Reducing Illness in the Workplace Policy.

7. Serpent River First Nation - Organizational Reopening of the Community
